The Burchfield Center was established on the campus of the State University College at Buffalo in 1966, and has a dual purpose, to develop as a regional Center for the exhibition, study and encouragement of significant art expression in Western New York, and to exhibit works by Charles Burchfield, internationally acclaimed watercolorist from Western New York.

The Burchfield Center's Center-Out Program was begun several years ago. The purpose of the program is to bring the resources of the Burchfield Center to youth, young adults, adults, senior citizens, and the handicapped in the Western New York area who cannot come to the Center to participate in our Center-In Program.

In 1979 the Center-Out Program was partially underwritten by public funds from the New York State Council on the Arts, which allowed for an expansion of the existing program. The Education Program of the Center extended an invitation to the Williamsville elementary schools to take part in our Center-Out Program in January of this year. In March we began a series of visits to those schools that had accepted our invitation. Volunteers trained by the Education Program staff made three visits to each school, bringing to the pupils information about the Burchfield Center with a presentation including a film, slides, and original art work. The concluding visit featured an art activity which incorporated ideas explored during the presentation.

The present exhibition features selected art works created by pupils during the art activity sessions of the Center-Out visits. By exhibiting these children's original and delightful accomplishments we hope to encourage their pursuit of creativity in artistic media, and above all, their continuing appreciation of the genuine feelings communicated by persons through the varied forms of visual art.
